SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

POLICY: It is the policy of KCCD, Inc. to award scholarships to qualified applicants with available funds by vote of the Board of Directors members. Individual awards shall be decided upon by the board and will be granted for tuition expenditures at an accredited college or university.

APPLICABILITY: All members of KCCD or their immediate family.

DEFINITION: Scholarship Program: Monies shall be made available from the general fund.

Board of Directors: The elected officers and directors of the organization to include the presidents of those chapters in good standing with the statewide organization.

Immediate Family: Includes spouse and children, including children whom the member has adopted or serves as a legal guardian.

PROCEDURES:

- A. Each chapter, individual member or member's immediate family, may submit an application to the immediate past president for consideration of a monetary award being granted.
- B. The Board of Directors will review any and all cases presented.

- C. This application should be submitted during the month of July for the Fall semester and during the month of November for the Spring semester.
- D. The applicant must submit proof of enrollment for the relevant semester in order to be considered.
- E. A majority vote of the Board of Directors is required to make any award.
- F. Failure to satisfactorily complete the semester will result in the recipient being required to repay KCCD, Inc. the full amount awarded. Satisfactory completion means an overall grade point average of "C" or 2.0 on a 4.0 scale for each semester.
- G. Priority will be given to those eligible parties without other means of assistance (i.e., scholarships, tuition assistance).
